Shaffer Parents,

Our staff has prepared work for students they may complete during this time off from school until spring break. K-5 student packets are available to be picked up at the office this week. Grades 6-8 were sent home with all their textbooks and should have received a daily assignment sheet. Middle School students have access to the assignments online, that will be placed upon the class webpage at [www.shafferschool.com](http://www.shafferschool.com). These will be updated weekly starting tomorrow. Some K-5 students received their packets if they were at school yesterday, and some did not. If your child did not come home with a packet, please come to the office this week to receive these from Mrs. Polan. We encourage you to set up a schedule each day that they can stay on track with learning, so they do not lose momentum toward the progress they have made this school year

Our staff will be preparing brown bag breakfast and lunch meals, to be available for pick up starting Thursday March 19-April 3, for students who receive free and reduced meals regularly. We will prepare these meals daily and set up three pick up locations for parents. These sights will include Wendell (Cardena's Driveway), Levitt Lake Fire Station and Shaffer Elementary (Multipurpose Room). Pick up time for meals will be between 10:00-10:30am each weekday until April 3<sup>rd</sup>.

I have had several parents ask to help getting meals distributed and some have asked if they could donate financially, to help families in this time of need. At this time, the Shaffer Staff are prepared to work together to prepare and deliver meals but I want you to know that help is always welcome.
